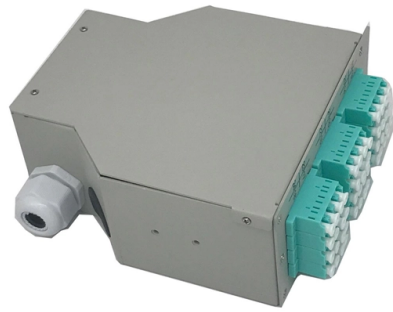


Does the drop fiber optic cable for home access need to be spliced



Overview

This cable does not have factory-installed optical connectors and requires splicing on both ends. One end of the cable is spliced in the optical box/cabinet in the corridor of the building, and the other end of the cable is spliced in the ATB (Access Terminal Box), in the. When deploying a FTTH network, subscribers must choose the right drop cable interconnect solution. This is for both ends of the drop cable—the distribution point. Let's break down four of them: the fiber patch panel, fiber splice, optical splitter and fiber drop cable. Don't worry, you don't need to be an engineer to understand how they work. Both techniques have their advantages and are suited for different applications, but understanding which method to use can greatly impact the network's. Q: What is the minimum bending radius of FTTH drop cable?

A: Generally, the cable shall be bent no less than 20 times the diameter for installation and 10 times for static use. Follow the manufacturer's specifications at all times.
