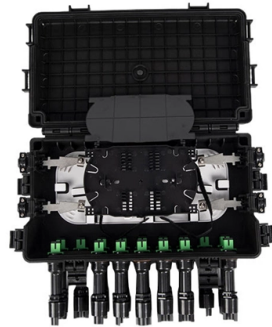


How are cable tray down conductors routed



Overview

Tees and Crosses: Create branches in the system to route cables to different areas.
Reducers: Used to connect trays of different widths, often when moving from a main run (wide) to a branch run (narrow).
Covers: Protect cables from falling debris, dust, moisture, and unauthorized access. When completely installed, without damage either to conductors or structural system use maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is erect the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray.
