

Spacing of fire pipe cable trays



Overview

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the distance between them should be no less than 0. This spacing is crucial for adequate maintenance access, ease of inspection, and ensuring proper airflow for effective heat dissipation. All sizes above are measured from the outer edge of the services. Distances Shown are applicable to Vertical & Horizontal Applications within a. Safety Distances Between Cable Trays and Pipes

The parallel safety distance between cable trays and common process pipes (e.g., compressed air pipes) should be no less than 0.4 meters. In

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Separation Gap for Primary and Secondary Life Safety

Each (Primary and Secondary) 120min rated supply cable shall be installed on its own lidded steel tray. A clear horizontal air gap of ≥ 300 mm shall

Minimum Service Distances / Spacing

Fire Dampers should be maintained within a separate seal. Every effort should be made to keep a minimum 200mm separation to other Fire Dampers, Ducts or typical penetrating services.
